2023 Annual BFA Exhibition: Another Kind of Time opens at the H&R Block Artspace & KCAI Gallery April 15 – May 13, 2023



Kansas City, Mo. (April 11, 2023) – In celebration of a new generation of artists and designers earning a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from the Kansas City Art Institute, the H&R Block Artspace and KCAI Gallery are pleased to present the *2023 Annual BFA Exhibition: Another Kind of Time*. The exhibition opens to the public on Saturday, April 15, from 12-5 p.m., and it will remain on view through May 13, 2023.

Featuring recent work by over 100 artists majoring in Animation, Art History, Ceramics, Creative Writing, Fiber, Filmmaking, Graphic Design, Illustration, Painting, Photography, Printmaking, and Sculpture with minors in Asian Studies, Entrepreneurial Studies, Social Practice, and Sound, this annual exhibition provides many of these artists with their first public exhibition opportunity while also representing the culmination of their BFA degree program.
